### Feasibility Study Report Highlighted at Calumet Heritage Conference

A four-year process to create a Calumet National Heritage Area entered its final phase at the 17th Annual Calumet Heritage Conference on Saturday, October 29, 2016 at Lake Etta County Park in Gary, Indiana. The conference focused on the final presentation and open discussion of the feasibility study findings to create a National Heritage Area for the bi-state Calumet region. The findings were presented by Dr. Mark Bouman, President of Calumet Heritage Partnership and Chicago Region Program Director at The Field Museum. Special highlights from the film documentary Shifting Sands: On the Path to Sustainability were shown and presented by author Dr. Kenneth Schoon and producers Tom Desch and Pat Wisniewski. The afternoon portion of the conference featured guided tours by Calumet Heritage Partnership's board members that explored their "favorite places around the region" with a hike to the beach at Cowles Bog and a journey along the region's three major rivers.

  - "more about current relationship between industry and conservation as it relates to sustainability"
  - "would like to see this become more consciously recognized in minority communities"
